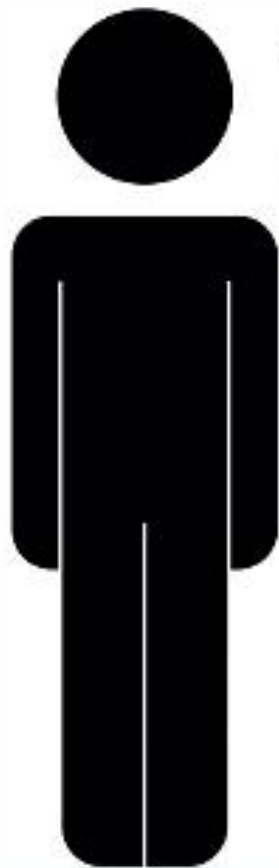

Between 40,000 and 60,000 Timorese people died during the War (all civilians), that is, between 8% and 14% of the population.

British military and civilians who died numbered 0.8% of the population



United States deaths were 0.3% of their population.



Australian deaths were 0.4% of its 1939 population.
